**Show What You Know® Publishing donates to Texas school destroyed by fire**

Show What You Know® Publishing has donated nearly \$3,000 of Show What You Know® on the TAKS workbooks and flash cards to Lockney ISD in Lockney, Texas, after a devastating fire destroyed its high school building.

Students were relocated from both the high school and junior high buildings to local Methodist and Baptist churches. They call their new schools the “downtown campus,” a name now used by many Lockney teachers and administrators, too.

“These students are resilient,” Lockney ISD Curriculum Director Marva Rasco said. “The learning environment is crowded, but I’ve been really humbled walking up and down the halls and seeing how everyone has adapted with their teaching and their materials. We are just very fortunate to have teachers who are so capable. Nothing can take the place of a very caring, effective teacher.”

Shortly after the fire, Rasco said the district began receiving an overwhelming amount of donations, mostly from the Lockney community and other Texans. Lockney schools had been using Show What You Know® on the TAKS workbooks and flash cards this school year to prepare their students for the Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) in March and April. Many of the Show What You Know® products had been destroyed in the fire, and Show What You Know® Publishing donated needed materials to the district so that its test preparation would not be hindered by the disaster.

Rasco said she was shocked by the amount of materials she received from Show What You Know® Publishing and that the generous donation was greatly appreciated by her and her teaching staff.
